Joseph E. Johnson III, M.D., MACP

Dr. Johnson graduated from Vanderbilt University, receiving the BA degree in 1951 and the MD degree in 1954. He interned on the Osler Service of the Johns Hopkins Hospital and, after serving two years active duty in the U. S. Navy from 1955-57, returned to Johns Hopkins to complete his residency in Internal Medicine. He was a fellow in Infectious Diseases and Immunology (1958-59) and was the Osler Chief Resident at Johns Hopkins, 1960-61. He was then appointed to the faculty at Johns Hopkins in Infectious Diseases and also served as Assistant Dean for Student Affairs (1963-66). In 1966 he was appointed Chief of Infectious Diseases, Department of Medicine at the University of Florida College of Medicine. While at Florida, Dr. Johnson advanced to Professor of Medicine (1968) and also served as Associate Dean (1970-72). He spent a sabbatical year at the Clinical Research Centre in London, England from 1970-71. In 1972 he was appointed Professor and Chairman, Department of Medicine at the Bowman Gray School of Medicine of Wake Forest University where he remained until 1985. During this period he served as President of the Association of Professors of Medicine, member of the Board of Governors and Executive Council of the American Board of Internal Medicine, Governor (including Chairman of the Board of Governors) and Regent of the American College of Physicians, Chairman of the Federated Council of Internal Medicine, member of the AAMC Council of Academic Societies Administrative Board and of the Executive Council of the Association of American Medical Colleges. He was also a member of the Task Force of the National Study of Internal Medicine Manpower (1976-82).

He served as Dean of the Medical School of the University of Michigan from 1985-90 and as Professor of Medicine (Infectious Diseases) at Michigan from 1985-93. In 1993 he became Senior Vice

President for Membership of the American College of Physicians, serving as Interim Vice President in 1994-95, and subsequently as Senior Vice President and Special Advisor to the Executive Vice President of the College. He was also appointed Adjunct Professor of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania. In 1998 he became President-elect of the International Society of Internal Medicine (ISIM), serving as President from 2000-02. He was on the Executive Committee of ISIM from 1996-2004.

Honors have included appointment as Markle Scholar in Academic Medicine and election as a Fellow of the Royal Society of Medicine, Fellow of the Johns Hopkins Society of Scholars, member of Societe Francaise Tuberculose et des Maladies Respiratoire, Association of American Physicians, the American Clinical and Climatological Association, and Mastership in the American College of Physicians.

Dr. Johnson's clinical activities have been in the fields of Internal Medicine, Infectious Diseases, and Immunology. Research activities in the pathogenesis of bacterial infections, the role of hypersensitivity and immunity in infection, pulmonary host defense mechanisms, emerging infections, and the epidemiology and immunology of adverse drug reactions have resulted in over 100 articles, book chapters and editorship of 3 books.
