Professor Napier Thomson trained in Renal Medicine in Adelaide, Australia and after postgraduate research experiences in Paris and London moved to Melbourne, Australia to a clinical and academic position in Renal Medicine. His research has been largely in the area of mechanisms of injury in primary glomerulonephritis and over the last 10 years mechanisms of progressive renal injury resulting from either primary renal disease or associated with chronic allograft nephropathy. His research has been reported in over 150 publications. He is currently the Professor and Head of the Department of Medicine of Monash University, Director of the Department of Renal Medicine, The Alfred Hospital in Melbourne and President of the Royal Australasian College of Physicians.
